NOTE Update from EASA Dec 2023 newsletter re AI Regulation

Following lengthy trilogue negotiations, the European Parliament and the Council have reached an agreement on 8<sup>th</sup> December on the Artificial Intelligence Regulation. This new legislation takes a risk-based approach to the regulation of AI, imposing different obligations on different types of AI systems, depending on the risk they may represent for society and citizens. Transparency obligations would apply as well. More information available in the <u>Parliament's</u><sup>1</sup> and the <u>Council's</u><sup>2</sup> press releases. Some technical and legal adjustments to the text are still needed – which may not be anecdotal considering recent declaration by some Member States – followed by formal votes and adoption.
